### **NEWSLETTER – FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

#### Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018

Another week is nearly over! It has been very busy with three excursions for years three, four and six, as well as the Year 3 First Holy Communion Family Night. As a Catholic school, our faith is very important. Jesus Christ is at the centre of all that we do. Prayer, sacraments, scripture and liturgy are essential elements in the life of the Church and in our life here at St. Paul's. Another essential element is Social Justice, the way we speak and act towards one another is very important. Jesus taught and lived that we should treat others the way that we want to be treated. So in a catholic school, we show this by treating others with welcome, respect, care and understanding. No one should enter St. Paul's and feel unwelcomed. No one should be judged, particularly when their individual circumstances are unknown to others. No one should be targeted, victimised, bullied or subjected to aggressive and abusive behaviour.

This is not the nature here at St. Paul's. Our philosophy is that everyone is welcome. Everyone is an important member of the community. Everyone deserves a second chance. A policy will be sent home soon for your consultation and feedback regarding the behavioural expectations for all members and visitors to St. Paul's. As I wrote last week, St. Paul's is a happy and safe place and it is the responsibility of all (students, staff and parents) to keep it that way. In regards to this, there are some points I need to address:

#### ZERO TOLERANCE

We have a zero tolerance policy here at St. Paul's on physical violence. That means that any student who deliberately hurts another student will be sent home. It includes the immediate removal from the playground or classroom and follow up consequences of reduced or limited play options. This type of behaviour will not be accepted or tolerated. We are extending the zero tolerance to swearing as well. This means that any student who deliberately swears at another student with the intent to upset and offend will be sent home. In this case we are not talking about the accidental swear word that pops out from surprise, shock as the result of an injury. It is the use of highly offensive language and terms to upset and offend that we will not tolerate. This type of language can be just as damaging as physical violence. A more detailed letter will be sent home in the next week. We appreciate your ongoing and full support with this. I must stress that this is not a major problem here at St. Paul's, but there have been some incidents and we what to stop this from becoming a regular occurance.

#### **GRIEVANCES AND COMPLAINTS**

This is just a reminder that if there are any issues or problems, please speak to your child's classroom teacher first. In doing so, make an appointment with them to discuss the issue in private. If they are unable to solve the issue, then they will direct you to make an appointment with a school leader. I encourage you to do this as soon as you become aware of or concerned about any issues involving your child.

#### **STUDENTS PLAYING OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL GATES**

It has come to my attention that there are some students using the large grass area (vacant land) next to the car park to play soccer and other games before school. This is to stop. It is not a play area. The carpark is a busy place in the morning and the last thing we need is for a student to chase a ball and be hit by a car. Once the gates open at 8.30 am, all students are to move into the school grounds, gathering in the courtyard before heading to their classrooms. This is for their own safety!

Next week we reach the end of May and therefore the end of Autumn. Winter will officially begin. We are already seeing signs now! Just a reminder to ensure your child/children are properly dressed for the colder weather! Mr Daly returns on Monday, we look forward to the experiences and photos that he will share with us. This will be the last you will hear from me for a while. I have enjoyed my time as Acting Principal, though I am a little tired as it has been a very busy three weeks.

If you don't see me about the place next week it will be due to the fact that I'm locked in my office having a **'long winter's nap**!' Does anyone know where that line is from? There's a prize for the first person that tells me!

# **URGENT REQUEST**

As of the first day of Term 3, Monday 16 July, all excursion and school activity permission forms will be sent out to families, through CareMonkey. It is therefore, essential that all children have a CareMonkey Profile, in order for parents to be able to give permission for their children to attend excursions or take part in school activities, requiring parent permission or consent. We ask all families to set up a CareMonkey profile for their children IMMEDIATELY.

Email invitations are continuing to be sent to all families for whom we have an email address, to download the CareMonkey app. Thank you to those parents who have responded to the email and have set up a profile for their children. If you have not yet responded to the email please do so as soon as possible. *Please check your email inbox or spam for the CareMonkey email*. Thank you for your support in ensuring your children are safe and cared for at all times.



#### STUDENT ABSENCES

Following a review of the Attendance Guidelines by the Minster for Education in Term 4, 2017 <u>'schools</u> <u>must advise parents/guardians of unexplained absences, on the same day, as soon as practicable,</u> <u>including for post-compulsory aged students'</u>. All schools must fully implement the changes to the Attendance Guidelines by the end of Term 2, 2018. These changes will help ensure the safety of schoolaged children during school hours and that schools are supported in their duty of care obligations.

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, we ask that you log onto the Skoolbag app, then go to eForms, hit Absentee Form and complete the details of the absence then hit Submit. All Absentee Forms are sent to the Principal. They are then forwarded to the classroom teacher and the office. As of early Term 2, if your child is away and we have not been notified, you will receive an SMS message asking you to contact the school. If we do not hear from you within a certain time (to be notified) we will call your emergency contacts. If we cannot reach the emergency contacts we are mandated by legislation to call the police. If you have not yet downloaded the Skoolbag app, we ask that you do this as soon as possible. These practices are to ensure the safety of your children.

Full implementation of the new Attendance Guidelines is required by the end of Term 2, 2018. St. Paul's is currently exploring an automated SMS notification service, to inform parents of an unexplained student absence. *Parents and guardians are asked to notify the school immediately a student absence is known, preferably the day before but definitely before 8.50 am on the day of the absence.*

Thank you for your support in ensuring the children remain engaged, we optimise their learning time and teachers are able to make best use of the morning learning & teaching block.
