Dear Community,

Yesterday we celebrated with the parish, the Solemnity of The Assumption of The Blessed Virgin.

Our parish, St. Paul's, Kealba & St. Mary MacKLillop, Keilor Downs, is named under the patronage of St. Mary of The Asumption. Her feast day acknowledges that she, Mary, was taken to heaven, body & soul, and remains there with her Son, Jesus Christ, with God the Father and with God the Holy Spirit.

Much of our church, its beliefs & its teachings, are a mystery; we accept them in faith, without explanation and understanding of them. #### **FOOD SHARING - BIRTHDAYS**

The policy of St. Paul's Primary School regarding food being shared, is that this is not to take place under any circumstances. This policy was introduced some years ago, in a large number of schools throughout Australia, in the interests of the wellbeing & safety of all children. It has come to my attention that parents have been bringing packs of lollies to school to be distributed in class, to acknowledge their children's birthdays. I have instructed all staff that this is not to occur. Without written parent permission for every child in the grade to accept the lollies, the school is placed in a very serious breach of our duty of care. It may also place lives at risk, if a child has an undiagnosed, life-threatening allergy. Parents are welcome to put together a 'Party Pack', consisting of small, non-food party items, for the teacher to distribute, acknowledging a child's birthday. Please do not place teachers in the awkward situation of having to refuse the distribution of 50 lolly bags or cupcakes, brought to school to acknowledge birthdays.

#### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEYS

My thanks to those families who have filled out the 2018 School Improvement Survey. All parents received the survey last week (242 surveys were sent home) and can fill out the hard-copy/paper version or the online version, using the unique User I.D. & Password, provided in the survey envelope. Your survey responses help us to plan for the 2019 school year, as well as in setting direction for St. Paul's as a learning & teaching community. *To date we have only had 10 online surveys completed and 35 paper surveys completed, out of the total 242 surveys sent home.* You have until Friday August 24 to complete the survey.

# **UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES – USE SKOOLBAG TO LET US KNOW!**

Parents are asked to notify the school in advance of their children being away, by phone, a note or on the SkoolBag App. Teachers must mark attendance rolls by 9.10 am each morning; If your child is marked as absent from school without an explanation, you will be sent an SMS message or receive a phone call; if a parent does not respond to the SMS or phone call, the child's emergency contacts will be contacted; if the school is unable to make contact with the emergency contacts and parents have not responded to the school's contact, the assumption will be made that the child is missing and police will be called. All schools (primary & secondary) in the state of Victoria are now obliged BY LAW to follow this process, when a student is marked on an attendance roll, as absent without an explanation.



# WHOLE SCHOOL PERFORMANCE - 'CIRCUS EXTRAVAGANZA'
