Dear Community,

Last week, St. Paul's, along with all Victorians, celebrated 'Cultural Diversity Week', under the theme of, 'Proud To Belong: Your Generation Your Stories'.

It was an opportunity to celebrate & acknowledge how diverse & mixed our great nation is culturally & ethnically. With the existence of Victoria's First Peoples, our indigenous brothers & sisters, remaining in continuous connection to this land, successive waves of migration have seen people from all over the world arrive in our state. Today, almost half of Victorians were either born overseas or have at least one parent who was born overseas. We come from 200 countries, speak over 260 languages and follow more than 130 different faiths. Victoria is considered one of the most successful multicultural societies in the world. Multiculturalism is a part of the Victorian identity, character and way of life. This is our multicultural story. It is part of who we are as Victorians.



On Monday March 18, we celebrated 'St. Paul's Cultural Diversity Day'. The children spent the day engaged in a number of activities, which focused on some of the many cultures & ethnic groups which make up our 'St. Paul's Family'. Hopefully this experience encouraged the children to think about their own ethnic backgrounds and that they came home with questions about your family's 'story'!

An underlying theme of our cultural diversity experiences of last week, was the consideration of those in our local & wider communities, who are less fortunate than we are. The children's purchase of gelati on Monday last was a fundraising initiative, to provide financial support to 'Joseph's Corner', a social support group for mothers & their children, affected by drug & alcohol abuse in their families. Sr. Jean Dwyer, a Josephite sister, manages 'Joseph's Corner', in Yarraville and will be coming to school next Thursday, to receive a cheque for \$2006.00, raised by St. Paul's, to support the wonderful work she does with those in the community in need. 'Joseph's Corner' lives out the mantra of St. Mary MacKillop, the founder of the Josephite sisters, to "Never see a need without doing something about it".



May I say a very big "Thank you", to all our St. Paul's family for their support of Cultural Diversity Day and indirectly for their support of Sr. Jean and the work of 'Joseph's Corner', through the money raised.


