Dear Community,

As we come to the end of Week 5, we are half way through the ten weeks of Term 2. Your children have been working consistently & enthusiastically, putting great effort into their learning, in spite of coughs & sneezes, colds & the flu and 'tummy bugs'. Well done Kids! Keep up the hard work!

Teachers too are working hard, continually assessing your children's progress and delivering rich & rigorous classroom programs, as they begin the process of writing your children's 'Student Achievement Reports', due out on Friday June 21.

As Parent-Educators it is appropriate, indeed essential, that you too 'assess' your children's learning, as they progress through the school year. I do not mean that you should be setting them assessment tasks at home (test, exams, etc.) and keeping assessment records. Rather, it would be great if you 'check in' with them at the end of each school day or at times throughout the school week and ask them about their learning, as well letting them share some of their work, brought home from school. It would also be great to use home as a place of learning for them, by involving them in helping with meal preparation & cooking, putting together shopping lists & going shopping with you, allocating cleaning & home-organisation duties and discussing environments & places of interest whilst out in the car.

In having those 'learning conversations' with your children, you may wish to use some of the following prompts / questions in the car after school, at home around the dining table or listening to them read or talk about some of the work they have brought home:

- I am pleased to see your effort in ....
- I am proud of your improvement in .....
- What makes this your best work in ....?
- How did you go about doing it?
- Did you come across/encounter any problems?



Your interest in your children's learning progress & achievements is vital, in developing their confidence & motivation, to work to the best of their abilities. As parents, guardians & teachers, it is our responsibility to ensure that we work together in partnership, to develop a love of learning in our children, as they come to understand themselves as learners in their world.

Thank you for your support, as we work to together to ensure the best outcomes for your children.
