Dear Community,

I hope our shorter week and longer weekend last weekend, allowed you all to have a mid-term rest, catch your breath and build up some energy to see yourselves through to the end of 2019.

Monday November 4 was 'Report Writing Day' for teachers; it was a day spent in continuing to work on your children's 'Student Achievement Reports', which have been in the writing process since June of this year.

The December 2019 Student Achievement Reports are a culmination of student effort & learning and teacher planning & educating. Your children's 'reports', along with formal & informal parent/guardian-teacher conversations, should give you a clear 'picture' of where they are on their 'learning journey'.



Our new Parental Portal will allow you to access reports electronically, compare your children's progress throughout the year and be able to print their report at any time. This is the first stage of ongoing online assessment for St. Paul's; it is our hope that in and over time we will be able to provide you with real-time progress for your children. In other words, we are hoping to develop an assessment system that will let you login to a parent portal and check your children's current at-that-time progress.

All Catholic primary schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne are progressively moving online functions & data bases to a new sector-wide program, called ICON (Integrated Catholic Online Network). ICON will allow schools access to a common suite of 'modules', with common functions and common data sets; the modules are eLEARN, eADMIN & ePLAN. It is via ICON that we hope to allow families access to current & real-time student progress.

Your children have worked hard this year and they have achieved great results; their Student Achievement Reports are celebration of their efforts and a clear indication of the next steps they will need to take on their 'learning journey'. Please read their reports with them and be sure to tell them how proud you are of their hard work & efforts throughout 2019.

Thank you for your ongoing support, as we work together to ensure your children achieve the best they can.

2020 FEE & LEVIES SCHEDULE – EXPLANATION & BREAKDOWN

I write to you to inform you of our 2020 fees and to explain payment methods, so that there is no confusion. The statement which you will receive at the beginning of the 2020 school year will be the **FULL** amount for fees, levies and camp (where applicable) due for the entire year.

There has been an increase in 2019 school fees and levies, as per my letter of explanation dated 1st September 2018. Every effort has been made to keep these increases to a minimum. The following explains

all areas of fees and levies at St Paul's Primary School. Fee collection is how we continue to provide a rich and

well-resourced education and school facility for your children.

We have provided a number of options to meet the needs of our families; these are listed on page two.

• If you commit to a Direct Debit, Credit Card or Centrepay Agreement,

YOUR PAYEMENT OF FEES, LEVIES AND CAMP FEES ARE INCLUDED AS PART OF THIS AGREEMENT AND THE AGREEMENT WILL BE VALID UNTIL YOU WITHDRAW IT.

- If you choose to pay in person at the office and not commit to any agreement the:
 - CURRICULUM-I.C.T. LEVY: IS TO BE PAID IN FULL BY THE END OF FEBRUARY EACH YEAR
 - FEES: <u>ARE TO BE PAID IN FULL BY 11th SEPTEMBER 2020</u>
 - CAMP FEE: IS TO BE PAID IN FULL 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO CHILD ATTENDING CAMP

Excursion/Sports and Curriculum-I.C.T. Levy: these levies pay for work books, excursions, stationery, library books,

I.C.T. resources and all the resources needed to educate your child. As from 2013 the Curriculum Levy has included all necessary stationery items which your children will need for the entire school year; you are not required to purchase any stationery items for your child. These items will be distributed to the children by the classroom teachers.

<u>School Fees</u>: are based on a Family Fee and not attributed to individual children. These fees pay for the running costs of a school, such as insurance, maintenance, power, gas, water and so on. These fees are, in fact, due and payable at the start of the school year. As you would no doubt be aware, many other schools ensure this happens. However, I am mindful that this, in many cases, is simply impossible. Therefore, agreements can be entered into to which suit the needs of your family and ensure that the **account is paid in full by 11th September 2020.**

<u>Camp Fees</u>: will be invoiced to families with students in Grades 4, 5 and 6 and are payable 14 days prior to the child attending camp, unless you have a Direct Debit, Credit Card or Centrepay Agreement.

We have made every effort to keep costs to a minimum and still provide a rich, relevant and well-resourced education for your children.

If you are experiencing any difficulties please remember to come and speak to me as early as possible; together we will work out appropriate alternatives.
