CHILD SAFETY

In ensuring the safety of every child at St. Paul's, the following is our 'Statement of Commitment to Child Safety' ...

St. Paul's Primary School prioritises the safety and wellbeing of all children in our care.

We work with diligence and intent to protect them, prioritising their safety and wellbeing at all times and in every situation.

The staff team of St. Paul's takes very seriously our 'Duty of Care' owed to your children whilst in our care, our role whilst acting 'In Loco Parentis' – 'in place of the parent', and our legislated obligations under Child Safety Legislation. Schools must comply with the legal obligations that relate to managing the risk of child abuse under the *Children, Youth and Families Act 2005 (Vic.), the Crimes Act 1958 (Vic.), the Child Wellbeing and Safety Act 2005 (Vic.)* and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 (Vic.).

The Child Wellbeing and Safety Act 2005 (Vic.) introduced the seven Victorian Child Safe Standards which aim to create a culture where protecting children from abuse is part of everyday thinking and practice. The Child Safe Standards were introduced in response to recommendations made by the Betrayal of Trust report.

Ministerial Order No. 870 – Managing the Risk of Child Abuse in Schools was made under *the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 (Vic.)* and sets out the specific actions that all Victorian schools must take to meet the requirements in the Child Safe Standards.

The 'St. Paul's Primary School Child Safety Policy 2019', is designed to enable St. Paul's Primary School to comply with Standard 5 of the Victorian Child Safe Standards: processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse, as well as the school-specific requirements for procedures for responding to allegations of suspected abuse in Ministerial Order No. 870.

All staff employed at St. Paul's Primary School, sign an annual 'Code of Conduct', specifically relating to their conduct whilst employed at St. Paul's Primary School, in ensuring the safety of your children.

PARENT, GUARDIAN, TODDLER, ADULT VISITORS & CONTRACTOR FACILITIES

Student toilets should not be used by parents, guardians, toddlers, adult visitors or contractors. Non-student toilet facilities are available off the Gallery Space (beside the Discovery Centre/Library). This is about the safety of your children at all times.

CSEF 2020 APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card (eg Health Care Card) or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The annual allowance is \$125 for primary school students, and is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if:

New student enrolments - your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.

Changed family circumstances, such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card **number**, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

ENTRY TO SCHOOL GROUNDS

For the safety of all our children once the school gates are closed during school hours, all parents, visitors, couriers, contractors, visiting the canteen or any part of the school grounds, must report to the office before going to classrooms. This includes all Prep families attending for the Prep children's testing this month.

SCHOOL UNIFORM DONATIONS

If families have school uniform items they no longer need or use i.e. (children have left St Paul's, no younger siblings to pass uniform onto, etc.) and they are in good condition, could you please drop them off at the office. These will be used in the sick bay for children when they have been sick or have an accident.

LOST PROPERTY

If your child is missing a school uniform item from last or this year, could you please check our lost property container or seat outside the canteen? If items are labelled with your child's name the items can be returned. However if they not labelled they will be donated to the Sick Bay.

There has been an increase in 2019 school fees and levies, as per my letter of explanation dated 1st September 2018. Every effort has been made to keep these increases to a minimum. The following explains

all areas of fees and levies at St Paul's Primary School. Fee collection is how we continue to provide a rich and

well-resourced education and school facility for your children.

We have provided a number of options to meet the needs of our families; these are listed on page two.

If you commit to a Direct Debit, Credit Card or Centrepay Agreement,

YOUR PAYEMENT OF FEES, LEVIES AND CAMP FEES ARE INCLUDED AS PART OF THIS AGREEMENT AND THE AGREEMENT WILL BE VALID UNTIL YOU WITHDRAW IT.

- If you choose to pay in person at the office and not commit to any agreement the:
 - CURRICULUM-I.C.T. LEVY: IS TO BE PAID IN FULL BY THE END OF FEBRUARY EACH YEAR
 - FEES: ARE TO BE PAID IN FULL BY 11th SEPTEMBER 2020
 - CAMP FEE: IS TO BE PAID IN FULL 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO CHILD ATTENDING CAMP

Excursion/Sports and Curriculum-I.C.T. Levy: these levies pay for work books, excursions, stationery, library books,

I.C.T. resources and all the resources needed to educate your child. As from 2013 the Curriculum Levy has included all necessary stationery items which your children will need for the entire school year; you are not required to purchase any stationery items for your child. These items will be distributed to the children by the classroom teachers.

<u>School Fees</u>: are based on a Family Fee and not attributed to individual children. These fees pay for the running costs of a school, such as insurance, maintenance, power, gas, water and so on. These fees are, in fact, due and payable at the start of the school year. As you would no doubt be aware, many other schools ensure this happens. However, I am mindful that this, in many cases, is simply impossible. Therefore, agreements can be entered into to which suit the needs of your family and ensure that the **account is paid in full by 11th September 2020.**

<u>Camp Fees</u>: will be invoiced to families with students in Grades 4, 5 and 6 and are payable 14 days prior to the child attending camp, unless you have a Direct Debit, Credit Card or Centrepay Agreement.

We have made every effort to keep costs to a minimum and still provide a rich, relevant and well-resourced education for your children.

If you are experiencing any difficulties please remember to come and speak to me as early as possible; together we will work out appropriate alternatives.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.
