TERM 2 FINISHES

Term 2 finishes tomorrow Friday June 26, at the earlier time of 1.50 pm. Please be sure to make alternative pick up arrangements for your children at the earlier time. Pick up will be from the pickup points listed below:

- Family names beginning with A-K; pickup point St. Paul's Church front door.
- Family names beginning with S-Z; pickup point the gate between the hall & library.
- Family names beginning with L-R; pickup point the school hall side entrance, closest to the church car park.

Please remember:

- No parents or guardians are to come into the pickup areas at pick up time.
- Children not picked up from the designated pick up areas by 2:10 pm, will be taken to the office and parents or guardians called

SICK CHILDREN & COVID-19 TESTING

If your child is unwell please do not send them to school. At this time of the year we can expect children to have coughs, sneezes, upset tummies & fevers; if your child has symptoms, no matter how small or mild, please keep them at home until they are completely recovered.

If your children, yourself or a family member who live in the your household, go to the doctor or a testing site for a COVID-19 test, please remain at home and/or keep your children at home until you receive the test results.

TERM 3: DROP OFF & PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS

Due to the recent spike in COVID-19 cases, we will continue our current drop off & pick up arrangements to start Term 3. Parents & guardians will not be permitted on site. Children will need to walk to their classroom in the morning without their parents. Excursions, Camps, Interschool Sport, parent involvement in the school or with fundraising, will all remain on hold. We will continue to be directed & guided by the State Government Chief Health Officer, the Department of Education and the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria. If there are any changes to current directives & school opertraions, these will be communicated to you immediately.

DROP OFF:

Drop off will continue at the normal time slot of 8:30 am to 8:50 am. Once you have parked your car, please direct your children to the closest crossing. The basketball court will continue to be opened for parking & dropping off; a staff member will be there to direct students into the school.

PICKUP:

Pick up in Term 3 will now commence from 3:10 pm.

The three different pickup points after school remain as follows:

- Family names beginning with A-K; pickup point St. Paul's Church front door.
- Family names beginning with S-Z; pickup point the gate between the hall & library.
- Family names beginning with L-R; pickup point the school hall side entrance, closest to the church car park.

Please remember:


- No parents or guardians are to come into the school at drop off time or into the pickup areas at pick up times.
- Parents or guardians needing to attend the office, should inform a staff member on duty at drop off & pick up time, before proceeding directly to the office.
- Children who are dropped off after the 9.00 am bell should be brought to the office; parents or guardians must not take their children to the classroom.
- Children not picked up from the designated pick up areas by 3.45 pm, will be taken to the office and parents or guardians called.

TERM 3 - OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE PROGRAM (BEFORE SCHOOL & AFTER SCHOOL CARE)

To begin Term 3, the OSHC (Before & After School Care) Program will continue to operate out of the Multipurpose Room. The program will run as usual in the morning Monday to Friday and in the afternoon Monday to Thursday. Parents & guardians must register their children for the program by ringing Ms Sogna Tenace on 0450 451 909.

Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 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FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

سيتم توفير CSEF من قبل حكومة فيكتوريا لمساعدة الأسر المؤهلة. التعلية تكاليف الرحانت والمخيمات والأنشطة الرياضية المدرسية.

إذا كلام الملكون بطاقة التغليضات الخاضعة الخاضعة لإختبار المدخول سارية المغمول أو كلام والدي التيني المؤقف، فقد تكونوا مؤ هلين للحصول على CSEF. توجد ليضا فقة الإعتبارات الخاصة لطالبي اللجوء والأسر اللاجئة. يتم دفع المخصصات إلى المدرسة لإستخدامها في ما يتعلق بالفقات المتعلقة بالمخيمات والرحلات والأشطة الرياضية لصلح طفلكم.

- إن مبلغCSEF السنوي لكل طالب هي:
- 125 دولار أطاحب المدارس الإبتدائية
- 225 دولار لطائب المدارس الثلوية

Quỹ dành cho Cấm trại, Thể thao và Du ngoạn (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund) giúp đảm bảo là không có em nào bị lỡ mất cơ hội cùng các bạn trong lớp tham gia các hoạt động quan trọng, mang tính giáo dục và vui nhộn. Điều này nằm trong kế hoạch làm cho Victoria trở thành Tiểu bang Giáo dục và cam kết của Chính phủ nhằm phá vỡ mối liên hệ giữa nguồn gốc với thành quả học tập của học sinh.

QUÝ DÀNH CHO CÂM TRẠI, THỂ THAO & DU NGOẠN (CSEF)

Đi cảm trại với trường sẽ cho các em nhũng trải nghiệm lý thú ở bên ngoài, các cuộc du ngoạn khuyến khích tìm hiểu sâu sắc hơn về hoạt động của thế giới còn thể thao dạy các em kỹ năng làm việc theo nhóm, kỷ luật và lãnh đạo. Tất cả đều nằm trong khuôn khổ một chương trình giảng dạy lành mạnh.

CSEF sẽ được Chính phủ tiểu bang Victoria cung cấp nhằm trợ giúp các gia đình hội đủ điều kiện để trang trải chi phí cho các hoạt động du ngoạn, cấm trại và thể thao ở trường.

Nếu quý vị có thẻ giảm giá họp lệ được cấp dựa trên trác nghiệm tài chánh hoặc là cha mẹ nuôi tạm thời (foster parent), quý vị có thể hội đủ điều kiện để được nhận CSEF. Ngoài ra còn có một tiêu chuẩn cản nhắc đặc biệt dành cho các gia đình tấm trú và tị nạn. Khoản phụ cấp này được trả cho trường để sử dụng cho các chi phí liên quan tới các hoạt động cẩm trại, du ngoạn hoặc thể thao phục vụ lợi ích con em quý vị.

Số tiến CSEF hàng năm cho mỗi học sinh là:

- \$125 cho học sinh tiểu học
- \$225 cho học sinh trung học
