2021 CLASS GROUPS

Current class groups will remain the same moving into 2021. Students have spent a significantly reduced amount of time at school this year, with a consequent impact on developing friendship skills and class working relationships. We will not be taking requests for a child to be with or not with another student or with or not with a particular teacher. If you have any concerns relating to your child, please have a conversation with their current teacher, as they (the teachers) play a major part in the transition of students from one year level to the next, through a very thorough transition & handover process. Students will find out their 2021 teachers on 'Step Up day', on Monday December 14.



ST. VINCENT de PAUL CHRISTMAS COLLECTION

The St. Vincent De Paul Society has informed us this year that unfortunately, they will NOT be collecting non-perishable items for their annual Christmas Hampers, due to COVID-19 concerns. In place of the food collections, they will be giving out food vouchers to those less fortunate in our community. They are therefore, collecting money donations. In an effort to help their cause, we would like to 'dig deep' and extend this plea to our students and their families. In lieu of non-perishable food and Christmas items not being collected, we will be asking our families to help our wider community this year by giving money donations in Week 8 and Week 9 of the term. Classroom teachers will collect any donations from their students and their families each morning. We will be encouraging the students and their families to give generously and to think of others during this Advent season.



LOST UNIFORM ITEMS

Could families (parents & guardians) please check that all uniform items which are often taken off at school – jumpers, jackets, hats, sports jackets, etc. – are clearly labelled with the child's name. A number of parents have informed the school that clearly labelled uniform items have gone missing or been taken by mistake. Please check your children's uniform items listed above, to be sure that you do not have another child's uniform item, taken home by mistake. We also have a HUGE number of 'lost 'n found' uniform items, in the 'Lost 'n Found' tub, outside the First Aid Room. If you need to

check for a lost uniform item, please report to the school office and office staff will arrange for you to go through the 'lost 'n found' items.



WARMER WEATHER - HAYFEVER & DRINK BOTTLES

The warmer & windier weather is bringing with it an increase in the number of children with hay fever. Please be sure to administer hay fever medication to your children before they come to school each morning. Students who may require medication during the day need to provide the school with their medication and a Medical Health Plan, with all the necessary details filled out.



As detailed in last week's eNEWS, drinking taps (bubblers) have been switched off due to COVID-19 concerns. Every child MUST have a drink bottle with them at school. Drink bottles remain on the children's tables during class time and may be taken outside (and placed in class tubs) at play breaks, so they are able to have a drink while playing.
