

The Year 1 and Year 2 went on an excursion during week 1 to Como House and Gardens in South Yarra. Como House is one of Melbourne's most glamourous stately homes, built in 1847. The students were engaged in a tour of the house, hands-on activities and played old fashioned games. It was a great excursion to learn about the history of the past.

DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

MINI THUNDER

MINI THUNDER

Aussie Hoops is Basketball Australia and Victoria's National Development Program for kids aged 5-8. Mini Thunder is aimed as an entry-level into basketball participation, it's an opportunity to learn and develop new skills. The program is aimed at beginners playing basketball for the first time.

Mini Thunder in Term 4 is a 8week program with 1 x 45 minute session per week.



The refined and modified version of the game is a great tool in helping support a pathway from Mini Thunder to a higher standard of U10's Junior Domestic competitions.

U8's competition is aimed at 5, 6 & 7 year olds with some minor rule constraints to increase enjoyment, opportunity and development of skills and understanding for all kids involved.

U8's in Summer Season train weekly and play on a Friday afternoon



DEVELOPMENT SQUAD

Targeted at U10, 12 & 14 athletes wanting to advance and develop skills, athletes will taught concepts and the Keilor Thunder style of play throughout the program. The Development Squad offers Rep level training sessions with Rep & Senior Coaches. Aimed at current Junior Domestic and aspiring VJBL players.

The Development Squad in Term 4 is a 7 week program 1 x 60 minute session per week
