In Year Four we have been doing fantastic fun work. We love our work. It's so fun and easy to do work when you learn it!



Maths: In mathematics, we have been learning about fractions, time and conversions. In fractions, we have been focusing on equivalent fractions. We have also been learning how to work

out large multiplication problems using two strategies - box method and algorithm. My favourite

is the algorithm.

In Religion, we have been learning about the Creation Story. We learnt about different creation stories like the Aboriginal, the Chinese and the Catholic creation story. In the Catholic creation story,

them raw and we made pizza using our mushrooms. The pizza we made was delicious!



Excursions and Incursions: This term we went to the Melbourne Zoo and saw all the animals. We also had an incursion where a lady came with lots of different Australian animals. I got to touch and pet lots of animals including a koala!
