Lead us like Peter. Transform us like Paul.


When we doubt ourselves, remind us: you built your Church on someone who sank in fear and someone who once tried to tear it down. Lead us like Peter. Transform us like Paul.

YEAR 3/4 INCURSION

YEAR 3/4 PLANTING

During the last few weeks of Term 2, our Year 3/4 students have been involved in planting and growing plants from seeds as part of their Inquiry unit. Each student was involved in growing grass, sunflower, beans and flowers. The students were responsible for watering the plants and ensuring they were getting enough sunlight to grow.

Find out what some of the students thought about this hands-on experience.

We have been growing grass, beans, sunflowers and flowers. We have learnt that grass grows the quickest. Sunflowers take 75 days to grow. Plants need water, sunlight and oxygen to grow. (Penny & Claira)

I have enjoyed planting the 4 plants. They are beans, flowers, grass and a sunflower. When the plants were in our classroom, they did not grow much because they were not getting enough sunlight. We moved them into Miss Majczak's room, where there is lots of sunlight, and they are now starting to grow very fast! (Isla)

Daisy All-Sorts because I liked Daisy the dog because he barks, dances and sings funny songs. (Miranda)


The Potato People because I like potatoes! (Olivia N)
